SFCA prepares street issues report

The SFCA architectural control committee conducted a complete street inspection and reported the results to Mr. Rod Banks of DPW Road Repair with a request for action.

The report highlighted locations of "wobbly" paving at 11 intersections, extensive wide cracks on 18 streets, and general failure on nine streets.

The highest concentration of wide cracks was in the Twin Oaks School area in the 13th filing, including Avants Avenue, Berwick Avenue, Kimmeridge Drive, Todd Avenue, Trudy Drive and Wenham Avenue.

The committee considered that general failures included large portions of Goodwood Boulevard east of Sherwood Forest Boulevard, Westbrook Drive, and Havenwood Drive north of Goodwood Boulevard.

Mr. Banks responded promptly to the SFCA report after personally inspecting all streets. He explained the DPW is able to rehabilitate only about 15 percent of the number of streets it rehabilitated before the Green Light Construction Program took 70 percent of the additional half-percent sales tax voted in 1990 for street rehabilitation. The rehabilitation mileage decreased from 150 to 23 miles of street per year.

Citizen input is of the utmost importance. If the street in front of your home has any of these problems, call Mr. Banks at DPW (389-3090) and request a repair. Alternatively, you may dial 311 and initiate a service request.

The magic number – 311 – and more!

To find a governmental agency that can address your concerns, call **311** and speak with a Citizen Services Specialist. The call will create a service request that will automatically be routed to the proper department to deal with things like zoning violations, street and pothole repair, tree branch hazards, loose or nuisance pets, cluttered carports, single-family zoning violations, building violations and many more. These same issues may be submitted online at www.brgov.com (call 273-1353 for help if you have problems using the online method). **MOST IMPORTANTLY, YOU MAY REMAIN ANONYMOUS BY SIMPLY STATING THIS AS YOUR WISH!** You are encouraged to keep your neighborhood neat and clean and your property values high by reporting concerns through the city-parish services paid for by your taxes.

Call **911** in case of an emergency. The non-emergency number for City Police is **389-2000**. For suspicious situations that are not time-sensitive call the Sherwood Forest Citizens' Association Security Line, **273-1353**. Leave a call-back message, and include your e-mail for online communication.

Specific questions about streets, drainage and sewerage, construction and building codes or the environment should be directed to the Department of Public Works (DPW) at **389-3090, 380-2070**, or online at <http://brgov.com/DEPT/dpw/>.

To report general concerns about the neighborhood, call District 8 Metro Councilman Mike Walker's office at **272-9088** and speak with him or with his legislative assistant, Zona M. Pickens.

For the latest information about your subdivision, **PROVIDE YOUR E-MAIL ADDRESS** and listen to the messages sent out to the membership from the SFCAB board through its Internet-based voice-messaging system, **Notification Server™**.

Protect your property's value: update deed restrictions

Deed restrictions for four filings are due to renew later this year.

One of the most effective ways to protect and perhaps enhance your property's value and the quality of life in your neighborhood is to update your deed restrictions. This is the method you can use to actually "do something about" some neighborhood problems that have been frustrating you.

If you own a home in one of the following filings, you may contact **James or Jackie Gray** at 273-2930 (jrjhgray@cox.net), or **Gary Smith** at 273-1353 (security@sfcabr.org) to learn more about how you can protect your property's value. The entire process takes some time, so we need to get the ball rolling very soon if the filing's homeowners want to take advantage of this great opportunity. (Please tell your neighbors who live in these filings, too.)

Smoke detectors keep home, family safe from fire

If you didn't do so last month when we switched to daylight saving time, it's now time to check the batteries in your home smoke detectors. If you haven't changed the batteries since last spring, we recommend you change them now, even if the batteries still test "OK." This way the freshest 9-volt batteries will be installed in the most important home safety device for protection of your family and possessions.

ALL smoke detectors should be tested at least once a month. If one of your smoke detectors is more than 10 years old, it's time to think about replacing the whole unit, not just the battery. Nothing lasts forever, and the internal sensors can lose sensitivity over time. Manufacturers recommend a 10- to 12-year replacement cycle. Remember, pushing the test button tests only the battery, not the sensor.

Federal law stipulates many aspects of flag etiquette. The section of law dealing with American Flag etiquette is generally referred to as the Flag Code. Some general guidelines from the Flag Code answer many of the most common questions:

- The flag should be **lighted** at all times, either by sunlight or by an appropriate light source.
- The flag should be flown in fair weather, unless the flag is designed for inclement weather use.
- The flag should never be dipped to any person or thing. It is flown upside down only as a distress signal.
- The flag should **not be used for any decoration** in general. Bunting of blue, white and red stripes is available for these purposes. The blue stripe of the bunting should be on the top.
- The flag should **never be used for any advertising purpose**. It should not be embroidered, printed or otherwise impressed on such articles as cushions, handkerchiefs, napkins, boxes, or anything intended to be discarded after temporary use. Advertising signs should not be attached to the staff or halyard.
- The flag **should not be used as part of a costume or athletic uniform**, except that a flag patch may be used on the uniform of military personnel, fireman, policeman and members of patriotic organizations.
- The flag should never have any mark, insignia, letter, word, number, figure, or drawing of any kind placed on it, or attached to it.
- The flag should never be used for receiving, holding, carrying, or delivering anything.
- When the flag is lowered, **no part of it should touch the ground** or any other object; it should be received by waiting hands and arms. To store the flag it should be folded neatly and ceremoniously.
- The flag should be cleaned and mended when necessary.
- When a flag is so worn it is no longer fit to serve as a symbol of our country, it should be **destroyed by burning** in a dignified manner. Many American Legion Posts conduct ceremonial flag burnings from time to time and may be consulted if a need arises.

Code requires all house numbers to be visible

Sherwood Forest residents are reminded that the EBR Parish Municipal Ordinance, in Sec. 7:26: "Uniform Grid System," requires that all home addresses be displayed in **Arabic numerals no less than three inches high.**

Although the ordinance does not specify where the numbers must be displayed, we recommend placing them either above your front door on the eaves or to the right or left of your door. Most importantly, be sure no bushes, trees or other obstructions block either the doorway or the house numbers.

Always be sure there is **enough exterior lighting** on the premises to assure the numbers are visible from the street. In an emergency, there will be no guesswork!

Pruning tips for home gardeners

Azaleas are arguably the most beloved flowering shrub in Baton Rouge. The LSU Ag Center recommends the gentle pruning of azaleas after the flush of spring blooms has subsided. Pruning should be done carefully, only to control the size of the shrub. Among small trees in the Louisiana landscape, the "star" is the ubiquitous crape myrtle, introduced into the U.S. from the Orient in 1747. Pruning of crape myrtle trees always should be minimal, designed to remove basal suckers and damaged or crossed limbs. Pruning should be done during the dormant season, before the buds break. Never "top" or "round over" a tree by sawing off all branches except the main one. Such a tactic is unnecessary at best and dangerous at worst, leading to a shorter life span for the tree and an ugly silhouette before leaf-out. "When in doubt, DON'T" is a good rule to follow. Violators of parking restrictions are subject to ticketing



This is a reminder of the parking prohibitions in the neighborhood. We receive reports of parking violations regularly. To avoid a ticket and to maintain the safety and preserve the beauty of Sherwood Forest, please be familiar with the city ordinances regarding parking.

In summary, parking is not permitted on a sidewalk, in the area between the sidewalk and the street, on grass (particularly in the front yard), on medians (neutral grounds), in front of driveways, or close to intersections. Wreckers, 18-wheelers, and other large trucks are not permitted in the neighborhood except while providing pick-up or delivery services.

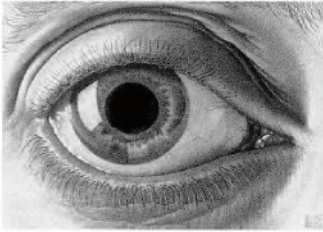

I believe that Sherwood Forest is still one of the safest neighborhoods in the parish and hope through our efforts we can keep it that way. I'm sure everyone heard of the armed robbery of an individual that occurred earlier this year. We all need to think about being careful, and there are a few simple things we can do for our own safety.

Those who walk late in the evening (after dark) are advised to have two or more in the party; you are always safer in a group. Always be mindful of your surroundings and pay close attention, especially if you hear someone

approaching from behind. Try not to carry a purse or wallet—you should carry only your keys—and, of course, always have your cell phone handy to call 911 if necessary.

It's also a good idea to keep some lights on outside at night. Lock all of your vehicles while they are parked at home. I have been advised that surrounding neighborhoods experiencing car burglaries determined that the would-be thieves were mainly targeting vehicles that were unlocked. 
